ABOUT CHRIST (DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY)

CHRIST (Deemed to be University) was born out of the educational vision of St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, an educationist and social reformer of the nineteenth century in South India. He founded the first Catholic indigenous congregation, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), in 1831 which administers CHRIST (Deemed to be University).

CHRIST (Deemed to be University) was established as 'Christ College' in 1969. It undertook path-breaking initiatives in Indian higher education with the introduction of innovative and modern curricula, insistence on academic discipline, imparting of holistic education and adoption of global higher education practices with the support of creative and dedicated staff. This multidisciplinary university which focuses on teaching research and service offers Bachelors, Masters, and Doctoral programmes in humanities, social sciences, sciences, commerce, management, engineering, architecture, education, and law to about 25,000 students. The flagship event will witness the presence of many eminent personalities from the legal fields ranging from senior advocates to Karnataka High court judges. The Competition is open for all students who are pursuing a three-year or five-year Law Degree Course in

Universities/Colleges/Law Departments in India, as recognized by the Bar Council of India.

It will be conducted from 23rd to 25th February 2023 and will be completely offline. In the previous 7 editions, NTAC has witnessed participants from law schools across the country and has successfully contributed to the promotion of a trial culture and criminal litigation. NTAC prides itself on being a one-of-a-kind trial experience that helps in honing one's research skills, and overall prowess of courtroom etiquette. This prestigious event has brought together multiple skilled teams from all over the country to compete in court halls which have witnessed some of the best Trial Advocacy Competitions.





INSTRUCTIONS AND PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION

Eligibility

The Competition is open for all students who are pursuing a three-year or five-year Law Degree Course in Universities/Colleges/Law Departments in India, as recognized by the Bar Council of India. The Participants should send a picture of their University ID Card for verification.

Venue

The 8th National Trial Advocacy and Judgment Writing Competition

2022-23 shall be held from 23rd to 25th February 2023 in CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bangalore Central Campus. It will be held offline.

Procedure for Registration

Participation in the 8th SLCU National Trial Advocacy and Judgment Writing Competition is restricted to 24 teams only. Institutions/Teams interested in participating in the Competition will have to provisionally register by sending an email to criminallaw.committee@law.christuniversity.in and only after confirmation of a provisional slot by the Organizers, should they complete the formalities of the final registration. The slots shall be reserved based on a 'first come' basis for the first 24 teams.





The teams should register through their respective Official College Email ID or any other recognized student association Email ID. Once the teams have provisionally registered, then the teams will be sent a confirmation mail providing them with the link for the Final Registration.

Only the teams who have received confirmation of provisional registration after receiving an email from the Committee must submit the registration form. Kindly note that only one team per College/Institution/University shall be permitted to take part in the Competition. The last date for provisional registration is 15th January 2023, and the last date for final registration shall be 22nd January 2023. The main invite shall be made available only to those teams that pre-register with the organizing committee.

Registration Fees

Registration Fees per team, exclusive of accommodation: INR 2500

Registration Fees per team inclusive of accommodation: 2500 + 6750 (2250 per day for one room) = INR 9,250

Accommodation is optional.
